The goal of this journal, beyond publishing high quality student work, is to develop the research capabilities and ambitions of students, publishing experience, teamwork and confidence in liaising with academics. To that end, students not only constitute the authors of the articles, but also all the Assistant Editors, Copyeditors and Proofreaders within the journal.

The inaugural issue attracted attention and success. This includes <u>national media coverage</u> of one of the articles, and citations in academic publications. This was very exciting news, particularly for a first volume, and an excellent start to the journal's life. We're looking forward to building on this in this second volume and beyond. This volume is produced with special thanks to Tara Coltman-Patel and Peter Lee for their editorial work and, as always, to our anonymous external peer-reviewers for committing their time in ensuring the quality of the work published.
